Please note: Access cards can only be issued to currently practicing lawyers or NZLS associate members.

Signatories must read and accept:

1) Cards are issued on an individual basis to New Zealand Law Society member lawyers and the proper use of the card is the responsibility of the signatory.

- 2) Cards must not be given to persons who have no right of admission to the library. No person is allowed to follow the card holder through the door (tail-gating).
- 3) New cards are provided for a fee of \$25 plus GST. Cardholders must notify the NZLS library immediately when a card is lost. There will be a replacement charge of \$35 plus GST.
- 4) When collecting cards from the library you will be required to show ID.
- 5) Cardholders must not write on the card to identify where it can be used.

Privacy and information handling
